Dear Valued Distributor Partner,

We are writing to proactively advise you of potential operational and transportation delays related to a winter storm system forecast to impact the Upstate South Carolina region beginning January 30, 2026. Current National Weather Service forecasts indicate the likelihood of snowfall, freezing temperatures, and deteriorating travel conditions across Anderson County and surrounding areas through the weekend. [forecast.weather.gov]

A Winter Storm Watch is in effect for our region from January 30 at 4:00 PM EST through February 1 at 7:00 AM EST, with new snow accumulations of 3–5 inches possible on Saturday, strong winds, and temperatures dropping into the low teens. These conditions may affect both regional road networks and carrier operations. [forecast.weather.gov]

In addition, forecast models indicate that Sunday, February 1, may bring some of the coldest temperatures of the season, with overnight lows expected to drop to around 12°F, accompanied by an Extreme Cold Watch for the region. These temperatures are significantly below seasonal norms and may contribute to prolonged road icing and extended recovery time following the snowfall.

No Expected Impact to Other Mölnlycke Distribution Centers

Based on current forecasts, there does not appear to be any weather-related operational impact for our distribution centers in:

- Northampton, PA
- Sparks, NV

We will continue monitoring for any changes, but no service delays are expected at these locations.

What this means for current and upcoming shipments

- Shipments routed through Anderson, SC may experience:
 - Reduced carrier capacity and weather-related service restrictions
 - Hazardous road conditions and potential closures
 - Carrier-initiated delivery holds for safety
 - Potential impact to Mölnlycke's Anderson, SC Distribution Center operations



- Weather impacts are outside of Mölnlycke’s control; therefore, any service delays tied to this weather event qualify as excused to the fullest extent permitted under applicable force majeure provisions.

Our proactive actions

- Actively monitoring conditions and NWS updates, including the Winter Storm Watch and Extreme Cold Watch advisories for the region. [forecast.weather.gov]
 - Coordinating closely with carrier partners regarding route adjustments and service capability.
 - Preparing customer service and logistics teams to provide status updates and contingency support as conditions evolve.

- If your orders are impacted, you may receive revised delivery appointment requests from the carrier.
 - Our teams will communicate directly with you should any significant delays or operational impacts arise.
 - Continued emphasis on safety for our employees, carriers, and the communities we serve.
